

Legislative Research Intern (Spring 2015)

The office of Senator Sue Crawford is seeking an intern for the 104th Legislature, First session beginning January 7th through June 5th. The position will have a time commitment of approximately 5-10 hours/week, with 1-2 hours meeting with staff and the rest completing work remotely. The main duty will be conducting literature reviews and other research on legislative topics. Meetings can be in Omaha or Lincoln depending on the intern's location. Qualified applicants must possess strong research and writing skills, be a self-starter who can work independently, and have the ability to maintain confidentiality and professionalism at all times.
