"Negotiation between strong and weak allies (in Korean)"

This research tries to explain why the strong ally sometimes has favorable outcomes in a negotiation with his weak partner, but sometimes not. The study contends that 'the request strategy' that the strong employs in the negotiation determines the negotiation outcomes. Using the case studies of 'U.S-South Korea Negotiation on additional dispatch of troops to Iraq' and 'U.S.-Japan Negotiation on military base camp relocation', the research verifies its argument and suggests a theoretical framework for solving the puzzle.
